Riverton, Utah was originally inhabited by Goshute and Ute tribes.



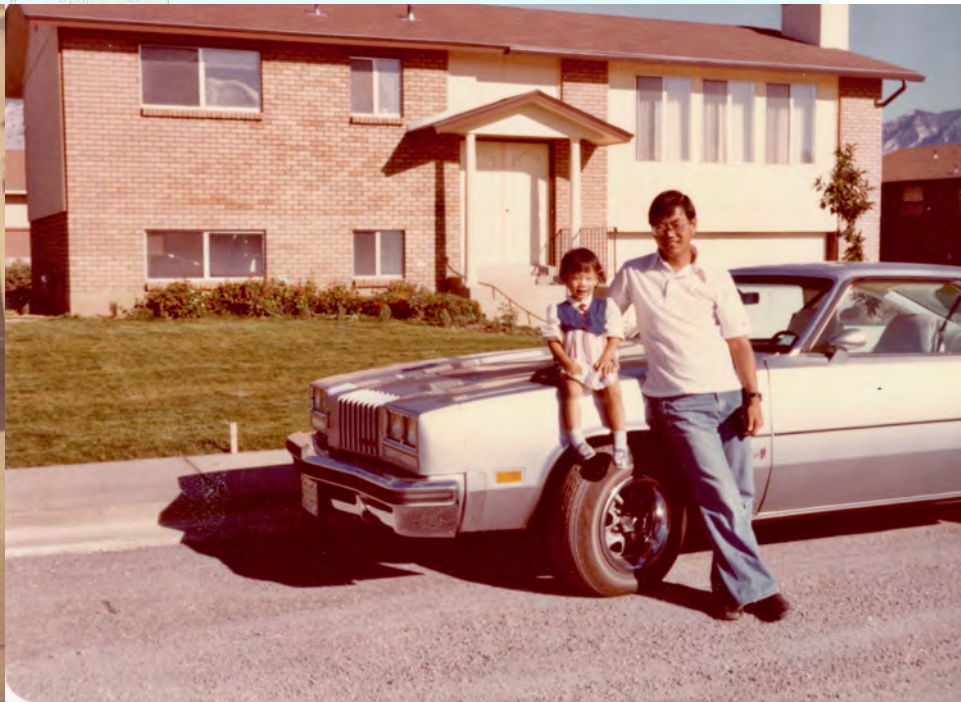
The Ute Indian Tribe of the Uintah and Ouray reservation is located in Northeastern Utah (Fort Duchesne) about 150 miles east of Salt Lake City, Utah. The reservation is in a three-county area, known as the Uintah Basin. The reservation is the second largest Indian Reservation in the U.S. and covers over 4.5 million acres. They have a membership of 2,070, and over half of the members live on the reservation.

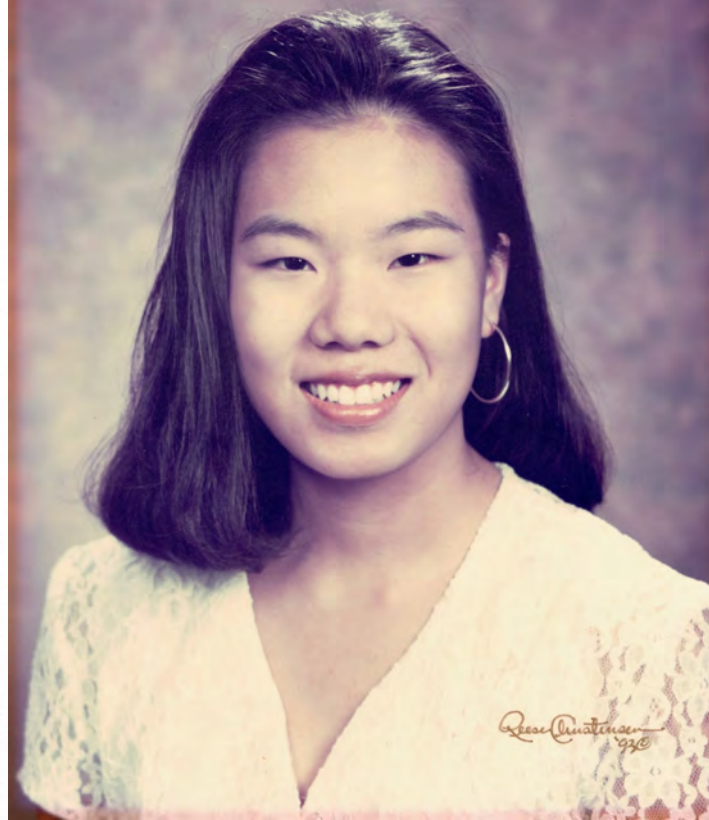
Three bands of Utes make up the Northern Ute tribe: the Whiteriver, Uncompahgre, and Uintah. The Uintah Band was first to call the Uintah Basin their home. Later, the Whiteriver and Uncompahgre bands were removed from Colorado to the Uintah Valley Reservation, creating the Uintah and Ouray Reservation.

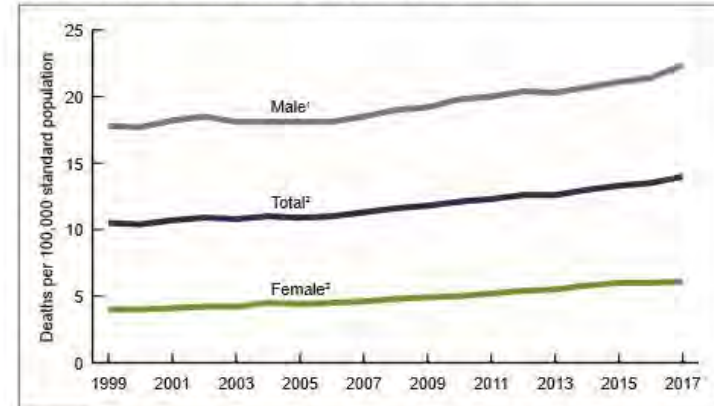
## More than 4,500 Utahns ages 10 and up attempt suicide each year.



From 1999 through 2017, suicide rates increased for both males and females, with greater annual percentage increases occurring after 2006.

- From 1999 through 2017, the age-adjusted suicide rate increased 33% from 10.5 per 100,000 standard population to 14.0 (Figure 1). The rate

# The Trevor Project Supports Asian American Communities

February 17, 2021

The Trevor Project condemns anti-Asian sentiment and racist acts of violence targeting Asian American communities across the country. Discrimination against Asian American Pacific Islander (AAPI) communities is not new, and acknowledging the country's long history of mistreatment of marginalized communities is an important step in working towards anti-racism.

As the largest suicide prevention and crisis intervention organization supporting LGBTQ young people, our crisis services are all too familiar with the unique mental health impacts of discrimination against AAPI young people. We know that these experiences can add to the rejection, violence, and prejudice that AAPI LGBTQ young people already face every day, and can increase their risk for negative mental health outcomes such as suicidal ideation.

Our research shows that AAPI LGBTQ youth report rates of depressed mood and suicidality that are higher than rates found among straight/cisgender AAPI youth, and AAPI transgender and nonbinary youth are at three times the increased risk for attempting suicide compared to cisgender AAPI LGBTQ youth.

We also estimate that more than 1.8 million LGBTQ young people seriously consider suicide each year, just in the U.S. alone. Last year, we directly served over 150,000 crisis contacts — 6% of which identified as an AAPI young person. We know as we expand our organization to reach even more of those 1.8+ million LGBTQ youth, we will soon serve a significantly higher number of AAPI LGBTQ young people.

# Facts About Suicide




- Suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death among young people ages 10 to 24.<sup>1</sup>
- LGB youth seriously contemplate suicide at almost three times the rate of heterosexual youth.<sup>2</sup>
- LGB youth are almost five times as likely to have attempted suicide compared to heterosexual youth.<sup>2</sup>
- Of all the suicide attempts made by youth, LGB youth suicide attempts were almost five times as likely to require medical treatment than those of heterosexual youth.<sup>2</sup>
- Suicide attempts by LGB youth and questioning youth are 4 to 6 times more likely to result in injury, poisoning, or overdose that requires treatment from a doctor or nurse, compared to their straight peers.<sup>2</sup>
- In a national study, 40% of transgender adults reported having made a suicide attempt. 92% of these individuals reported having attempted suicide before the age of 25.<sup>3</sup>
- LGB youth who come from highly rejecting families are 8.4 times as likely to have attempted suicide as LGB peers who reported no or low levels of family rejection.<sup>4</sup>
- 1 out of 6 students nationwide (grades 9–12) seriously considered suicide in the past year. [5]
- Each episode of LGBT victimization, such as physical or verbal harassment or abuse, increases the likelihood of self-harming behavior by 2.5 times on average.<sup>6</sup>

# 'Alarming surge' in anti-Asian violence across US terrifies community members

**Although it is difficult to prove recent incidents were fueled by bigotry, activists and community leaders say race has played a major role**

The Asian American community has reached a “crisis-point”, said Judy Chu, a California congresswoman who chairs the **Congressional Asian Pacific American Caucus**. Community members were “terrified by the alarming surge in anti-Asian American bigotry,” she said.

“These attacks are no accident,” Chu said. “It’s clear January 6 was not the only violence Donald Trump incited.”

Chu’s words come amid a wave of violent incidents against Asian American and Pacific Islanders across the US. Although it is difficult to prove that these violent incidents are purely motivated by bigotry, activists and community leaders, as well as victims and their families, think that race has played a major role.

# Utah parents complained after kids were read a story about a transgender boy. Now other diverse books are on hold.

Murray School District has suspended its “equity book bundles.”

“[Kyle Lukoff](#), who wrote “Call Me Max,” told The Salt Lake Tribune on Wednesday that the picture book was written for a kindergarten to third grade audience. And he believes it’s important for young students to see transgender characters and how those individuals are just like anyone else — with their own likes and dislikes and personalities. They’re a part of the community, he said.

Some kids, he said, might be transgender and appreciate the book for representing them. But, for many, he added, it’s just about being accepting and understanding.”
